WB Adkins taught math and was an Assistant Band Director in each of these schools, so the committee required that the recipients be an active band member to qualify for the scholarship.

Greetings Brethren,

In the April 2015 issue of Knight Templar, Sir Knight John L. Palmer published an article entitled "Masonic Philosophical Differences in the 21st Century." The article itself discusses how various "groups" have attempted to deal with the issue of declining membership. I became fascinated by



Brother Palmer's insights into the current make up of Masonic Lodges and the diverse philosophical ideals therein. Brother Palmer divides modern masons into three distinct categories:

1. Traditionalists (Palmer uses the less descriptive title status quos)

- a. Low Dues
- b. Great Emphasis on Ritual
- c. Casual Dress
- d. The issue of declining membership is cyclical

2. Neo-Moderns

- a. Marginally Higher Dues
- b. Lower Memory Requirements Overall
- c. Casual Dress
- d. Recruitment/One Day Class proponents

3. Neo-Antients

- a. Much Higher Dues Structure
- b. Emphasis on Philosophy/Ritual
- c. Formal Dress
- d. Emphasis on the "intiatic experience"

It is my guess that one of the three brief summaries (of the far more complex philosophical outlooks) resonated with you more than the others. It seems as though there is a debate on what the future of Freemasonry should look like and which, if any, of the above strategies should be emphasized.

In contrast to this argument, I think that we must realize that Freemasonry must be large enough and multifaceted enough to allow for all of the above perspectives to coexist. It is our challenge, as a 21st Century lodge, to provide our members with the Masonic experience that is best for them. It takes good men with various talents, skill sets, and perspectives to make Masonry, or any other worthwhile endeavor, work. J. B. Covert's active, diverse membership will continue to propel us into the future.
