Unlike a movie or concert ticket you can use it throughout the year to attend not only J. B. Covert Lodge, but any other in the Grand Lodge of Ohio and beyond!

Now you may have already considered that as a possibility, but when was the last time you tried it?

Here's an idea of what you may find when you travel with Masonry on your mind and heart!

One of our members was on a trip to Omaha Nebraska where he spent an evening with the Worshipful Master of Covert Lodge #11, of the Grand Lodge of Nebraska. During this visit he was shown an antique setting maul which was inscribed with the following:

Now some of the interesting things about this setting maul are that it says Omaha City N. T. or Nebraska Territory and that Covert Lodge was U.D. or under dispensation meaning they weren't chartered yet. Nebraska didn't become a state until 1867 and Brother Covert was traveling to meet fellow Masons in other territories!

Covert Lodge #11 was chartered by the Grand Lodge of Nebraska on June 22, 1866 and coincidently J. B. Covert Lodge #437 was chartered by the

Grand Lodge of Ohio on October 18, 1870.

So how is this relevant to me?

Simple! Masonry has so much more to offer than just the opportunity to come to a monthly business meeting and pay bills or a card to carry in your wallet.

Message from the East

Greetings Brethren,

In the August edition of the Scottish Rite's The Northern Light, Illustrious Brother Bruce T. Work, 33°, wrote an article entitled "Ritual Society or Fraternity" that tackles an important and ongoing issue within Freemasonry. The article posits that the focus of our Fraternity, for decades, has almost



exclusively been ritual. He further argues that this limited focus has been to the overall detriment of the Order, because Freemasonry is supposed to be a fraternity and a fraternity has an obligation "to fulfill the interests and needs of its members."

Ritual is clearly important. I firmly believe that there is no better point of entry than well-executed ritual, performed in a dignified manner. The truths revealed in the several Masonic lectures and charges are unparalleled in their depth. A candidate in the midst of taking his degrees should be working with a qualified mentor. This mentor has a responsibility to educate the candidate, not just regarding the required proficiency, but also in all aspects relative to the Fraternity. The degrees and mentoring should excite the candidate and prepare him for a long, fulfilling membership. However, this process and the ritual are essentially only the beginning.

As Bro. Work aptly states "Organizations today certainly compete for their members' limited time. But an equally important factor that remains undiscussed is the competition organizations face to fulfill the interests and needs of its members." If a Lodge does not address the wide variety of interests and needs of its members, it leaves itself vulnerable to high absenteeism and, even worse, suspending members of non-payment of dues. This unintentionally results in the active membership of a given Lodge being those who derive a great deal of satisfaction from the ritual and are not necessarily seeking other benefits of membership. It thus becomes a self-perpetuating cycle.

J. B. Covert has done a lot in the past several years to tackle this issue. In addition to our excellent degree work, we are continuing to make great strides in both our social and charitable endeavors. It is our hope that J. B. Covert will continue to develop into a Lodge that fulfill the interests and needs of its members.
