Message from the East

Greetings Brethren,

In last month's newsletter, I briefly mentioned the significance of the mentor-candidate relationship. It is a topic of great interest to me and during my time in Freemasonry, I have had the great fortune to mentor several candidates. The process is important and meaningful.



When a candidate petitions the Lodge, often times one of his sponsors is already a personal friend. This brother frequently takes the central role of mentor. Other times a candidate petitions the Lodge without knowing any of the Brethren and a brother volunteers to act as mentor.

In Masonry, we are often fond of saying that "everything we do has a reason." This is accurate but sometimes we forget to explain to our new members what those reasons are. The purpose of the proficiencies (and therefore, the candidate-mentor relationship) is twofold. The first is the obvious reason to teach the candidate the very basic tenets of Freemasonry. The second is perhaps the more important. The proficiencies are written in "code" so that every candidate must work with an informed brother in order to become proficient. The complexity and difficulty of the work necessitates frequent and multiple meetings outside of Lodge events.

In my view, the relationship of the mentor and candidate is absolutely crucial to the long term success of the candidate's membership. The fundamental building block of our Order is the fraternal bond between brethren. The mentor-candidate relationship is the start of that bond. The ideal mentor is an established brother in the Lodge. He is active, conversant in Masonic topics, and has a deep bond with his brothers. The typical candidate begins with few to no connections with the brethren but is still drawn to the fraternity by a need to learn and belong. Through the mentoring process and the degrees, the candidate should develop a fraternal bond with his mentor, which, in turn, should lead to eventual bonds with the rest of the brethren.

So the next time you sign a petition for a friend or meet a new candidate in the banquet room, consider volunteering to act as his mentor. The Master and Lodge Education Officer will be more than happy to provide you with the appropriate guidance and materials. I promise that it will be a rewarding experience.
